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Without Merian C. Cooper, who died April 21, 1973, *King Kong* would never have been born and *Godzilla* would never have met his onscreen monster match. Before producing films in 1930's Hollywood, Cooper was an aviator, an Air Force hero pilot, a Soviet prisoner of war for nearly nine months in 1920 and a global adventurer who was in some ways the



model for *King Kong's* showman character Carl Denham (played by Robert Armstrong), who sets sail for Skull Island to shoot a movie and winds up bringing a giant gorilla back to terrorize New York City.

King Kong went into production in August 1932 with Fay Wray as the blonde heroine with whom Kong falls in love. By the time it hit theatres April 7, 1933, Cooper had become

head of production for the film's studio, the financially distressed RKO Radio Pictures. He'd been working as executive assistant to the legendary David O. Selznick (*Gone With the Wind*) and when the Selznick quit in February 1933 after a corporate dispute over his production authority, Cooper took over. Before departing, Selznick changed the title of

Cooper's movie from *Kong* to *King Kong*. Because of that last minute change, the film's only reference to the character King Kong is a brief shot of his name on a marquee.

Cooper co-created the *King Kong* idea & story, co-wrote its screenplay and co-produced & co-directed the film together with Ernest B. Schoedsack. Unfortunately, in September 1933 Cooper suffered a heart attack and went on holiday until mid-

December. By early 1934 he was ill again and took an extended Hawaiian vacation. Returning in mid-May, he resigned and was succeeded at RKO by his assistant, Pandro S. Berman. Cooper's exit package from RKO included a deal to produce two movies -- *She*, which lost \$180,000 in 1935, and *The Last Days of Pompeii*, which lost \$237,000 in 1935. King Kong, however, had film rentals of \$1.8 million, blockbuster business at the height of the Depression in 1933. MGM, knowing a good thing when it saw one, offered to buy *King Kong* from RKO



before its release for \$400,000 more than its \$672,000 production cost. But RKO, also knowing a good thing when it saw one, refused to sell. Over the years, changes in movie library ownership brought *King Kong* to Warner Bros. and Legendary Entertainment, who also knew a good thing when

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they saw one. After the success of their 2017 hit *Kong: Skull Island* (\$566.7 million worldwide), they put Kong up to battle Godzilla in today's pandemic record setting hit *Godzilla Vs. Kong*.

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- Neon opened In the Earth opened this weekend in 547 locations to \$506K for a PTA of \$925. The horror suspense films stars Ellora Torchia, Hayley Squires, Joel Fry, Reece Shearsmith, Mark Monero, John Hollingworth and is directed by Ben Wheatley.
- IFC Films opened *Monday*, starring Sebastian Stan and Denise Gough, in theaters this weekend to an estimated \$22K from 54 theaters, for an estimated per theater average of \$407.
- Neon opened Gunda in 5 locations to a debut of \$5,000 and a PTA of \$1,000. The film directed by Victor Kossakovsky chronicles the unfiltered lives of a mother pig, a flock of chickens, and a herd of cows with masterful intimacy.
- Warner Bros.' Godzilla Vs. Kong continues to lead the box office in North America taking in \$7.705M in this, its third weekend for a North American cume through Sunday of \$80.515M in 3,001 locations. Warner Bros. represents 4 of the top 5 grossing films in the Domestic market since the beginning of the Pandemic.
- Universal's Nobody now in its fourth weekend in North America earned \$2.520M in 2,405 locations for a PTA of \$1,048 and a N. Am. cume through Sunday of \$19.051M. The action suspense film stars Bob Odenkirk, Christopher Lloyd, Connie Nielsen, Aleksey Serebryakov, RZA, Gage Munroe and is directed by Ilya Naishuller.
- Sony's release of Screen Gems' religious supernatural PG-13 horror film The Unholy now in its third weekend, earned \$2.060M in 2,057 locations for a N. Am. cume through Sunday of \$9.563M.
- Disney's Raya and the Last Dragon now in week 7 earned \$1.9M in 1,945 theaters for a N. Am. cume through Sunday of \$37,674,610.
- Warner Bros.' Tom & Jerry now in week 8, earned \$1.090M for a North American cume through Sunday of \$42.577M.
- Lionsgate's **Voyagers** now in its second weekend earned \$790,000 this weekend in 1,996 theaters for a North American cume through Sunday of \$2,558,674. The euphoric sci-fi thriller is written and directed by Neil Burger. Lionsgate acquired US rights to the film from AGC Studios.
- Atlas Distribution's *The Girl Who Believes in Miracles* in 1,012 locations earned \$561K in its third weekend for a cume to date of \$2,005,725.
- Roadside Attractions spy thriller *The Courier*, now in its fifth weekend earned \$462,830 in 922 locations for a cume to date of \$5,448,731.
 Reviews were strong for the film that stars Benedict Cumberbatch and Rachel Brosnahan in a Cold War drama, directed by Dominic Cooke.
- Universal's Croods: A New Age now in week 21 took in \$310K in 1,169 locations for a North American cume to date of \$57.089M.
- Lionsgate's Chaos Walking now in its seventh weekend earned \$215K this weekend from 1,242 locations lifting its estimated cume to \$12,989,908 million to date.
- A24's Minari now in its tenth weekend took in \$140K this weekend in 745 locations for a cume to date of \$2,485,468.
- Sony's Man In Love, the local language remake of the 2014 South Korean romantic drama, held the #1 spot in Taiwan for its 3rd frame with \$1.5M. The market cume stands at \$8.6M, which ranks as the highest grossing Taiwanese film released during the pandemic period.
- Warner Bros.' Godzilla Vs Kong has crossed the \$300M international and \$80M in North America. This weekend the film grossed \$19.9M globally from 42 markets in release (including the U.S. and Canada), \$12.2M internationally (for an international cume to date of \$309.7M) and \$7.705M in North America (for a N. Am. cume to date of \$80.515M) for a whopping worldwide cume to date of \$390.205M.
- Now in its second weekend, Warner Bros.' Mortal Kombat took in an estimated \$5.7M from 6,128 screens in 28 international markets in release, bringing the running overseas cume to \$19.2M.
- Sony's Peter Rabbit 2: The Runaway enjoyed another strong weekend as it added \$2.4M for an international cume of \$14.7M from 611 screens in Australia and New Zealand.

California's ArcLight and Pacific Theaters to close for good (Associated Press)

Los Angelinos were shocked last Monday when they learned that their beloved Pacific and ArcLight Theatres would not be re-opening after the pandemic. The announcement came in a letter sent to the Los Angeles Times by the Decurion

Company, the corporate owners of the two theatre chains, which includes the landmark Cinerama Dome and ArcLight Hollywood theatres. Prior to the pandemic, Decurion's Pacific and ArcLight brands operated 300 screens in California, offering a top-shelf moviegoing experience that had made them popular entertainment destinations for locals. Many hope that another exhibitor will step in to take over operations of these established locations in the heart of the U.S.'s largest box office market.

Last December, Warner Bros. created a quite a stir in the industry when it announced that its entire slate of 2021 feature films would be released simultaneously both in theatres and on-line on the HBO Max streaming service. Exhibitors howled at the studio's decision to eliminate the exclusive theatrical window, signaling the end of more than a

century of partnering with theatres to promote their films.

Only four months later, it seems that WB is now well along in its path to redemption. The studio's release strategy has not changed, but the results of the decision have begun to play out, with some promising returns both in theatres and on-line. As it so happens, Warner Bros.' films have tallied four of the top five box office weekends of the pandemic, led by *Godzilla Vs. Kong*'s opening weekend two weeks ago, which

earned \$31.6M in the Domestic market over three days. Equally important for the studio has been its success in growing the number of subscribers to HBO Max, which brings a recurring revenue stream coming through a direct customer relationship with consumers. By contrast, many studio films have either by-passed theatres entirely by redirecting to streaming-only releases or have pushed back theatrical releases to future dates when the pandemic restrictions will have eased. At least in the short term, WB's strategy has amounted to a win-win-win, for the studio, exhibitors and the consumer, providing big-ticket film entertainment across all channels. However, as other studio releases do return, exhibitors may pull back on WB titles in favor of films from studios which still offer an exclusive theatrical release window. Paramount's A *Quiet Place Part 2* will debut on May 28th, Universal's *F9*, releases on June 25th, and Disney/Marvel's *Black Widow* will premiere in theatres and on Disney+ on July 9th.

As Moviegoing Returns, Will Hollywood Studios Continue to Hide Box Office Grosses? (Variety)

Prompt and public reporting on U.S. movie ticket sales has been an accepted practice in the film industry for decades. The "weekend box office report" is a regular feature of Sunday news roundups, amounting to a regular, free promotion for movies and the movie business. However, the COVID-19 crisis has upended this tradition since studios have held back reporting grosses that have been miniscule when compared to pre-pandemic levels. In some cases, spin-doctors tried to cherry pick certain figures that show a glimmer of good news in a landscape of disappointment. One example was reporting results from the much-anticipated release of *Tenet* over Labor Day weekend 2020. Warner Bros. held results until a five-day total was ready, coming in at a "pandemic-best" of \$20.2M. This result was significantly below expectations and paled in comparison to the results from similar films which were released before the coronavirus hit. Indeed, many studios and distributors have also

experimented with selective reporting, while claiming that the traditional reporting would unfairly tar their titles as box office failures. However, as theatres recover, a question remains whether reporting on theatrical results will revert back to tradition or evolve into a selective exercise that highlights the successes and underplays the disappointments.

Awards shows are struggling to draw TV audiences. Should the Oscars be worried? (Los Angeles Times)

Next Sunday night, the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences will host the 93rd edition of Oscars, a ceremony to celebrate the best of the year in motion pictures. If we could ever use a celebration, this would be the year. In the most optimistic sense, this year's ceremony could signal a recovery after a difficult year, celebrating the determination of the movie industry to entertain in the face of a difficult year filled with uncertainty and shutdowns. On the other hand, there is concern about the size of the audience that will watch this year's Oscar broadcast, after other major awards programs have experienced steep declines in the viewership for the latest programs. The Emmys had 6.1M viewers for their September 20th program on ABC, the Golden Globes had 6.9M viewers for their February 28th program on NBC, and the Grammys had 9.2M viewers for their March 14th program on CBS. While last year's Oscar broadcast attracted

23.6M viewers, this year's is projected to draw only 12M – 15M. Awards programs represent one of the few examples of a major live event that can attract a relatively large national audience, making them appealing to networks and advertisers. The Golden Globes and Oscars are also unique events by which Hollywood can promote the industry itself, with star-power on full display and anticipation over the competition. In the past, advertisers have paid a premium for the opportunity to showcase their brand to the assembled audience, adjacent to the stars. These broadcasts also provide networks with an opportunity to promote their other programming to viewers who might otherwise not tune in to their network.

<u>'F9' Revs Up May 21 China Release; Further Overseas Markets Will Also Start Engines Ahead of Domestic</u> (Deadline)

Universal Pictures has settled on a rolling release strategy for *F9*, the upcoming installment to its popular *Fast and the Furious* film franchise. F9 will be timed to hit theatres first in the global markets which have recovered from the COVID-19 slump, with the first release in South Korea on May 19th, followed by Russia and Middle Eastern markets on May 20th

and China and Taiwan on May 21st. Its U.S. debut is now set for June 25th, which was recently pushed back by one month from a previously scheduled release date of May 28th, the Memorial Day holiday weekend. While there are clear indications of the recovery of moviegoing in the U.S., Universal deemed that it would be prudent to allow one more month for pandemic jitters to ease in the U.S., while building momentum for the U.S. launch in international markets. Prior films in the series have done exceptionally well in international markets, especially China where *The Fate of The Furious* (2017) is the second highest



grossing Hollywood film in history with \$368M, followed by Furious 7 (2015) which holds third place with \$414M.

Hollywood has taken note of the world-best box office returns from the Chinese market over recent months, led by a \$685M gross from China for the locally produced comedy *Detective Chinatown 3* which opened in February. Studios are showing flexibility in how they adapt to the uneven recovery in global markets, due to varied success in controlling the coronavirus pandemic. *F9* premieres in major European markets are currently scheduled from late June through early July.

Surprises are always possible when Academy members vote — but miracles aren't and that's what most of Oscar's 8 best picture noms need to win.

After Golden Globes/Drama, Critics Choice, PGA & BAFTA wins for picture & directing (DGA winner Chloe Zhao), NOMADLAND (6 noms) is the frontrunner. It and PROMISING YOUNG WOMAN are the only 2 contenders with key directing, screenplay & film editing noms. But it's not diversity driven. Frances McDormand's one big lead actress win was BAFTA. If Oscar weren't known for surprises – like PARASITE beating 1917 last year – NOMADLAND could relax.

PROMISING YOUNG WOMAN (5 noms) has resonated best for lead actress (Carey Mulligan - pictured) & original

screenplay (Emerald Fennell). But it could win if it's widespread #2 choice in preferential voting.

MINARI's (6 noms) challenge is being an acclaimed Korean-American film following 2020's acclaimed Korean best picture winner PARASITE.

TRIAL OF THE CHICAGO 7 (6 noms) has had its ups & downs (mostly). No directing nod for Aaron Sorkin & no lead acting noms to drive it. But winning SAG best cast (picture) helps since actors are the Academy's biggest voting branch.

Long shots sometimes win, so we shouldn't totally count out these 4 best picture noms.

With the most noms of all (10) & a screenwriting storyline, MANK should be a hot contender, but it's been ice cold all season. It has a directing nod (David Fincher), but isn't up for film editing -- or screenwriting! Not being diversity driven doesn't help.

Despite being critically acclaimed (RT: 98%), THE FATHER (6 noms) has been in the shadows all season, aside from (pictured) Anthony Hopkins' lead actor BAFTA win. There's no directing nod for Florian Zeller, but it's in the adapted screenplay & film editing races. With preferential voting, never say never.

JUDAS AND THE BLACK MESSIAH (6 noms) has been driven by ongoing supporting actor wins for Daniel Kaluuya (GG, BAFTA, SAG, CC), who's now the Oscar frontrunner. It's diversity driven and has an original screenplay nod, but it's not up for directing or film editing.

SOUND OF METAL (6 noms) is another contender that's resonated best on the acting front — for lead actor Riz Ahmed (National Board of Review win + many noms). No directing nod, but it's competing for original screenplay & film editing.
